I'm currently training in AI, particularly in what it can bring to technical documentation, in a controlled practice subject to my expertise: help with thinking and learning, variation of content according to user and/or context, linguistic revision, generation of visuals, and so on. The idea is to ensure that the essential content remains human-produced, with the targeted help of AI tools.

Over two years, I applied my expertise and technical skills to transform outdated, confusing PDF documentation into a user-friendly, accessible format, hosted on a secure documentation portal.

I created user-focused documentation with deep product knowledge, clear use cases, and structured review workflows. This included everything from configuration to functional features and API coverage.

I created and maintained one documentation website per major version (two per year) for four applications: managing site architecture, content, and i18n.

By implementing docs-as-code, I brought developers into the documentation process as co-authors. We collaborated using GitLab, where I led main, release, and working branch management—ensuring continuous integration and deployment.
